


Parent Questionnaire 2015 – 106 Returned


About Your Child

- All parents say their child enjoys being at Leamington, with 73% strongly agreeing and 27% agreeing.
- Most parents agree that their child is making good progress, but 3% are unsure.
- The quality of child’s teaching is mostly agreed as being good but 1% are unsure.
- 69% strongly agree that they are satisfied with the curriculum with 28% agreeing, while 1% disagree and 3% are unsure.
- The majority of parents feel their child is treated fairly by staff with 72% strongly agreeing and 32% agreeing. However 1% disagree and another 1% strongly disagree.
- Everyone agreed that their child is encouraged by staff to achieve their best, 71% strongly agreed and 29% agreed.
- Most parents agreed that there is a good range of interesting and enjoyable activities, 67% strongly agreed and 27% agreed. Although 6% were unsure.
- 67% of parents strongly agree and 30% agree that their child is encouraged to become mature and independent with 4% unsure.
- All parents agree that their child feels safe at school 68% strongly agree and 32% agree.
- Most parents feel staff treat their child fairly at school 66% strongly agree and 30% agree, but 3% are unsure and 1% strongly disagree.



Ethos and Attitudes


- The majority of parents agree that the school promotes worthwhile attitudes and values (63% strongly agree, 36% agree), however 1% disagree and 1% are unsure.
- Most of the parents agree that the children are well behaved at school (50% strongly agree, 46% agree) 2% disagree and another 2% are unsure.
- 53% of parents strongly agree and 39% agree that the school is effective at dealing with behaviour issues while 2% disagree and 6% are unsure.



Communications


- The majority of parents strongly agree (58%) or agree (39%) that they are satisfied with the range of opportunities they have to discuss their child's progress. However 3% disagree and 1% are unsure.
- Most parents are comfortable approaching the school with a question or concern 64% strongly agree and 34% agree, 2% are unsure.
- 56% of parents strongly agree and 41% agree that the school is good at seeking views of parents 1% disagree and 3% are unsure.
- 47% of parents strongly agree and 47% agree that the school acts quickly on parents' suggestions and concerns. 2% disagree and 11% are unsure.

- The majority of parents are happy with the overall communication from school to home (54% strongly agree, 41% agree). However 2 % disagree and 4% are unsure.




School Leadership

- 68% of parents strongly agree and 32% agree that the school is well managed by the Headteacher and leadership team with only 2% unsure.
- Most of the parents agreed (51% strongly agree, 35% agree) that the school has an effective governing body. However 15% were unsure.
- 44% of parents strongly agree and 31% of parents agree that they understand the role of school governors. 3% disagree and 1% strongly disagree and 23% are unsure.



School Provision


- When their child joined Leamington 64% strongly agree and 34% agree that they felt supported. Only 2% disagree.
- When their child last changed year group 59% strongly agree and 33% agree that they felt supported, 1% disagree and 7% were unsure.
- The majority of parents agreed (57% strongly agree, 39% agree) that the school is good at providing extra learning support when required, with only 4% saying they were unsure.
- 59% strongly agree and 35% agree that they are happy with the provision of school trips, while 3% disagree and a further 3% are unsure.
- 43% strongly agree and 25% agree that they are happy with the quality of school lunches, however 10% disagree and 2% strongly disagree. 20% are unsure.
- Nearly all parents are happy with the condition of the schools' buildings 63% strongly agree and 36% agree. Only 1% are unsure.
- Most parents are happy with the condition of the schools' grounds, 66% strongly agree and 32% agree. 1% disagree and 1% are unsure.



Leamington in the Community

- All parents agree that Leamington is a welcoming school (75% strongly agree and 25% agree).
- All parents agree that Leamington is an overall happy school (76% strongly agree and 24% agree).

- The majority of parents agree that the school encourages parents to be involved in its life and work, 61% strongly agree and 36% agree. However 1% strongly disagree and 3% are unsure.
- 51% of parents strongly agree and 36% agree that Leamington provides good access to a range of services and support from a wide range of community organisations. 3% disagree and 10% are unsure.
- Most of the parents agree, 48% strongly agree and 45% agree that Leamington is highly thought of in the community. 1% disagree and 6% are unsure.
- Everyone is happy overall with Leamington, 72% strongly agree and 28% agree.
- The majority of parents would recommend Leamington to others, 75% strongly agree and 29% agree with only 1% unsure.

What we should improve

- Communicating with parents could be improved and more important dates could be added to the website.
- Far too many dress up days.
- For my child I believe he is not using his full potential. At school, the school has encouraged him in regards to phonics but numbers and other subjects not so much.
- Playground assistants. Not fair or properly trained. They need to be supervised.
- Uniform reg, I feel it's unfair I paid for the correct uniform when over 50% of his class wear what they like!
- I don't appreciate text messages that are not for the year group my child is in.
- I think there should be teacher supervision at 9am & 3pm outside school near zig zag markings as parents are parking here to drop children off or pick up, one parent has been abusive to other parents.
- I think the area next to the canteen is wasted space left to weeds. It could be put to much better use. Also I have not purchased school photos for 3 years as I think they are awful. Maybe a change of photographer or someone to help children.
- I think it would be good if maybe someone with disabilities could come to the school and give a talk to all parents, as some parents don't know and don't understand that their children are around children with ADHD-ADD-Autism-Asperger Syndrome. I think this would help make people understand these kids a little better.
- Too many dress up days that have a theme so we have to keep buying costumes they only wear once.
- All good
- Think about the dressing up as some parents can't always afford the costumes so some children have to look at others in expensive costumes and their parents can't afford them.
- Maybe provide some opportunities after school hours, because as a working parent I feel that I miss out on being that bit more involved with school.

- More information on website – class pages, dates, menu etc. easily available, rather than given on piece of paper which children do not bring home. Dinner ladies need to check that children have eaten!
