Schools 90th Birthday

On the 4th February 2019, the school will be 90 years old. The Norris Green estate grew in the late 1920s, and with the increase in the number of families moving in, the need for several schools emerged. Work on building the school started in 1928 and in 1929 Leamington Infant, Junior and Senior school was opened. We still have the original registration book and punishment book which make very interesting reading!



To celebrate this special occasion, we are planning two events. Firstly, on the 4th February, we will be going back in time and teaching like it was 1929. The staff will be dressing up and organising the timetable so today's children can get a real sense of what it was like in post-war Britain. If you want your child to join in then please feel free to dress up as a 1929 school child (this is not compulsory). If you would like some ideas for what school life was like, the BBC have a

programme on the iPlayer called 'Back in Time for School' and episode 2 is from 1918 to 1939. Secondly, in the summer term, we are going to be having a 1929s afternoon tea with lots of dancing and celebrations. We will be opening up the school and are looking for as many ex-pupils from 1929 onwards to visit and join in.
