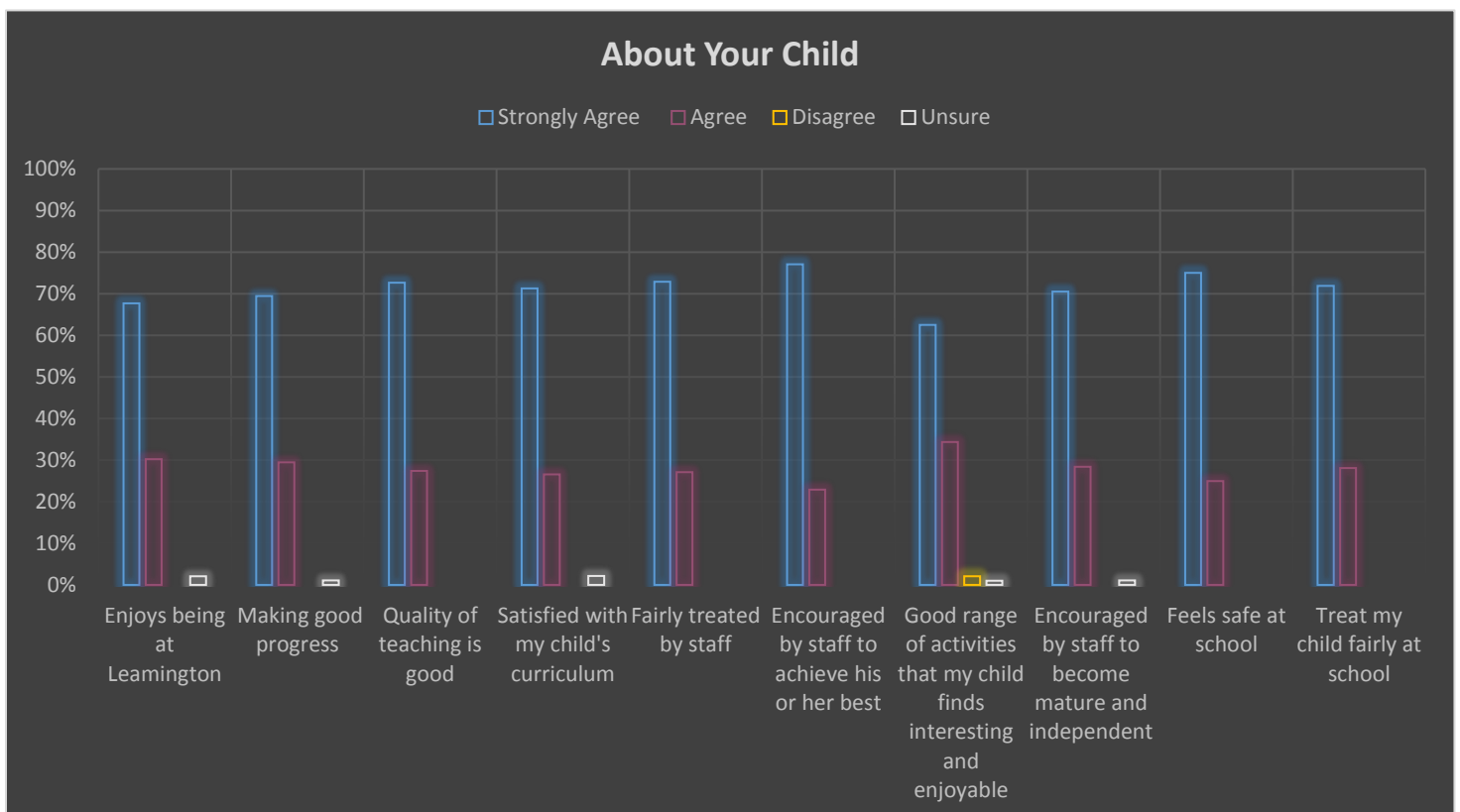


Leamington Community Primary School Parent Questionnaire 2019 – 97 Returned

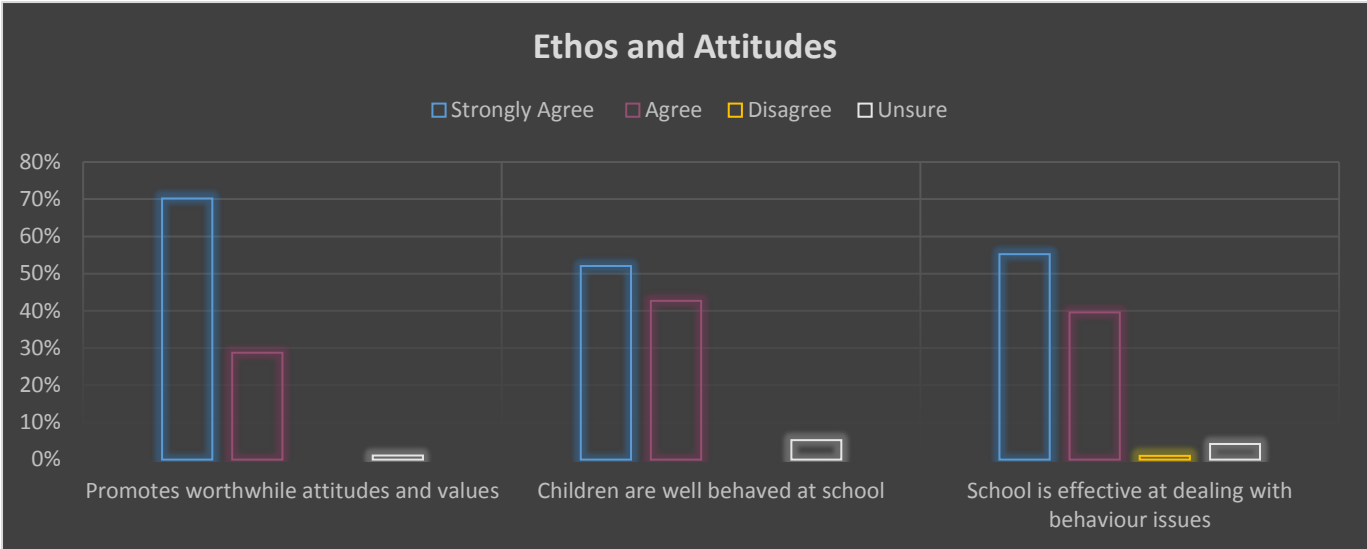
About Your Child

- Most parents say their child enjoys being at Leamington, 68% strongly agree and 30% agree, while 2% are unsure.
- The majority of parents agree that their child is making good progress, 69% strongly agree while 29% agree and just 1% are unsure.
- All parents agree that the quality of their child’s teaching is good, 73% strongly agree and 27% agree.
- 71% strongly agree that they are satisfied with their child’s curriculum and 27% agree while 2% are unsure.
- All parents feel their child is treated fairly by staff with 73% strongly agreeing and 27% agreeing.
- 77% strongly agree and a further 23% agree that staff encourage their child to achieve their best.
- Most parents agreed that there is a good range of interesting and enjoyable activities, 63% strongly agreed and 34% agreed. Although 2% disagree and 1% are unsure.
- 71% of parents strongly agree and 28% agree that their child is encouraged to become mature and independent, 1% are unsure.
- All parents agree that their child feels safe at school 75% strongly agree, 25% agree.
- Everyone feels staff treat their child fairly at school 72% strongly agree and 28% agree.



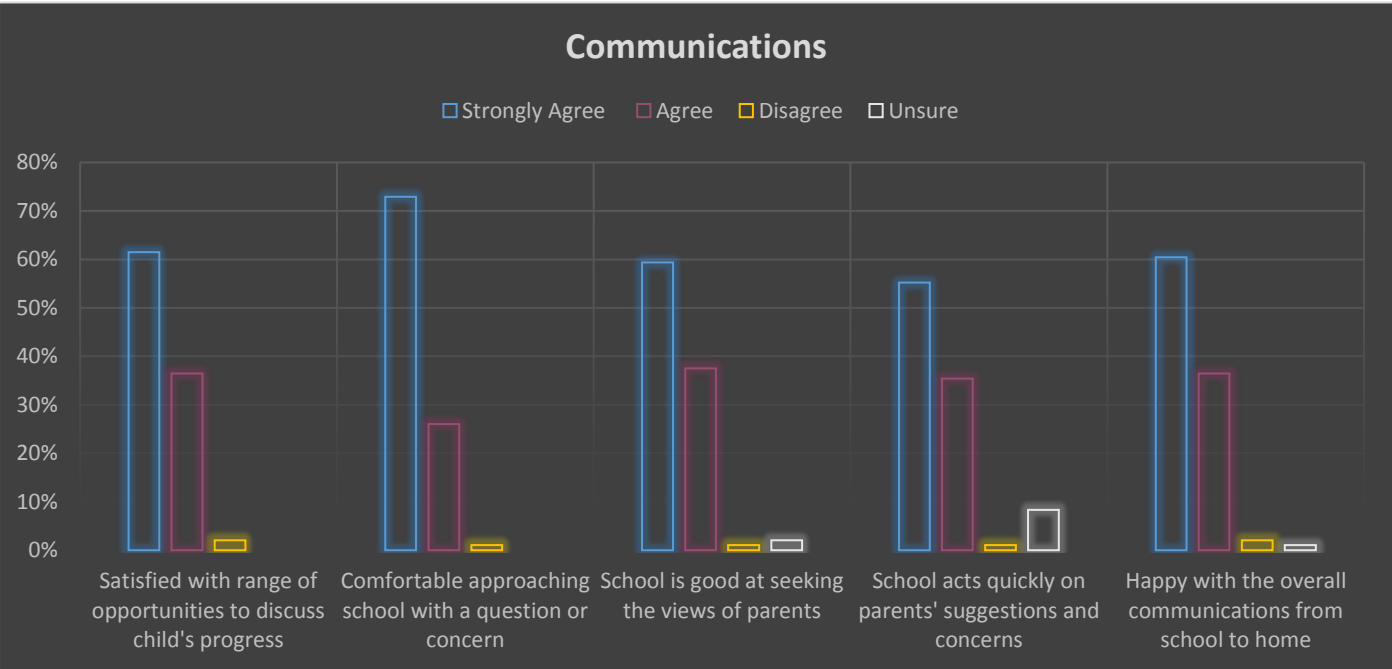
Ethos and Attitudes

- Most parents agreed that the school promotes worthwhile attitudes and values 70% strongly agree, 29% agree and 1% are unsure.
- Most of the parents agree that the children are well behaved at school 52% strongly agree while 43% agree, however 5% are unsure.
- 55% of parents strongly agree and 40% agree that the school is effective at dealing with behaviour issues while 1% disagree and 4% are unsure.



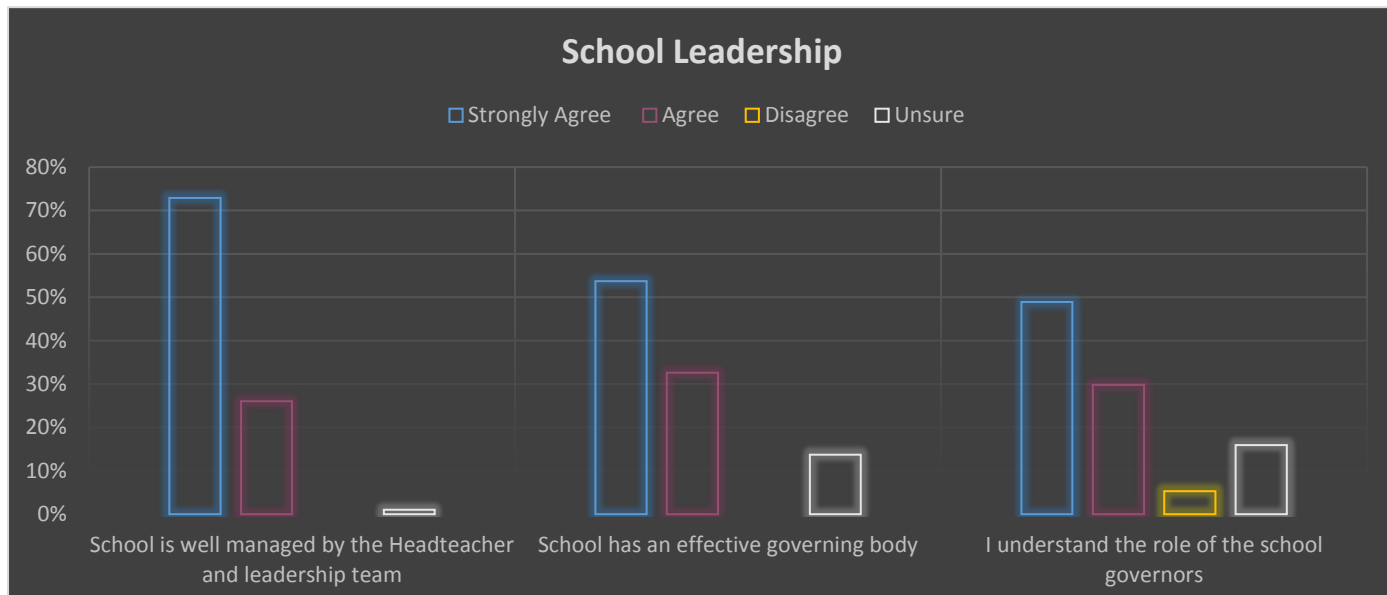
Communications

- The majority of parents strongly agree 61% and 36% agree that they are satisfied with the range of opportunities they have to discuss their child’s progress. However 2% disagree.
- Almost all parents are comfortable approaching the school with a question or concern 73% strongly agree and 26%, while 1% disagree.
- Most agreed that the school is good at seeking views of parents 59% strongly agree and a further 38% agree while 1% disagree and 2% are unsure.
- 55% of parents strongly agree and 35% agree that the school acts quickly on parents’ suggestions and concerns, yet 1% disagree and 8% are unsure.
- The majority of parents are happy with the overall communication from school to home 60% strongly agree and 36% agree, however 2% disagree and 1% are unsure.



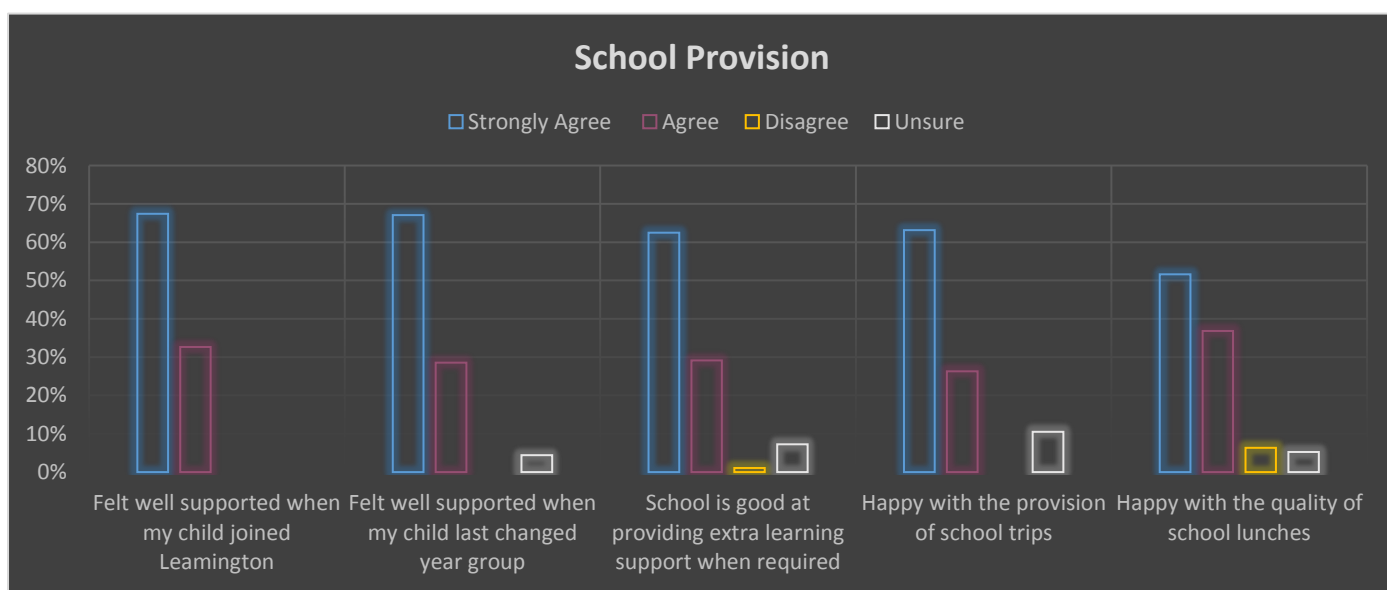
School Leadership

- 73% of parents strongly agree and 26% agree that the school is well managed by the Head Teacher and leadership team with only 1% unsure.
- Most of the parents agreed 54% strongly agree and 33% agree that the school has an effective governing body. However 14% were unsure.
- 49% of parents strongly agree and 30% of parents agree that they understand the role of school governors. 5% disagree and 16% are unsure.



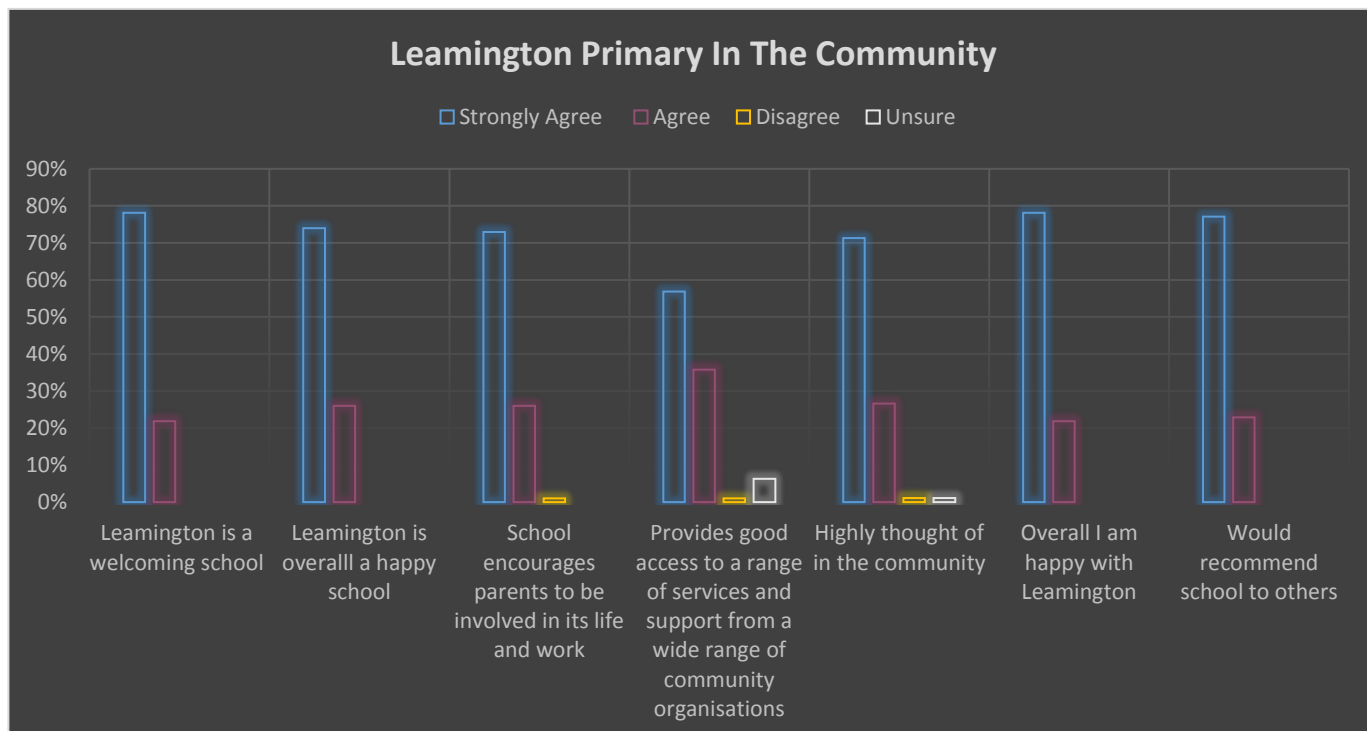
School Provision

- When their child joined Leamington all parents agreed that they felt well supported 67% strongly agree and 33% agree.
- When their child last changed year group 67% strongly agree and 29% agree that they felt supported, while 4% were unsure.
- The majority of parents agreed (63% strongly agree, 29% agree) that the school is good at providing extra learning support when required, 1% disagreed and 7% said they were unsure.
- 63% strongly agree and 26% agree that they are happy with the provision of school trips, while 11% are unsure. 52% strongly agree and 37% agree that they are happy with the quality of school lunches, however 6% disagree and a further 5% are unsure.



Leamington in the Community

- Everyone agrees that Leamington is a welcoming school, 78% strongly agree and 22% agree.
- All agreed that Leamington is an overall happy school, 74% strongly agree and 26% agree.
- The majority of parents agree that the school encourages parents to be involved in its life and work, 73% strongly agree, 26% agree and 1% disagree.
- 57% of parents strongly agree and 36% agree that Leamington provides good access to a range of services and support from a wide range of community organisations. 1% disagree and 6% are unsure.
- 71% strongly agree and 27% agree that Leamington is highly thought of in the community, while 1% disagree and 1% are unsure.
- All parents are happy overall with Leamington, 78% strongly agree and 22% agree.
- Everyone would recommend Leamington to others, 77% strongly agree and 23% agree.
