

## Leamington Community Primary School Guidance September 2020

### The following guidance is for all Parents and Pupils

*Normal school rules and procedures apply except for the following:*

- Breakfast club and after the school provision are closed.
- The attendance bus has been suspended.
- School is open from 8:45am for all pupils. Parents will be allowed on the yard but must keep to social distancing rules of 1m+ at all times. Pupils will have separate entrances to the building and will not be lining up. They will come straight in to the classroom from 8:45am onwards.
- **Pupils must arrive on time. By arriving late you can expect long queues through the main office and you will be putting yourself and others at unnecessary risk school is open from 8:45am. If you do have to enter the office you will be expected to wear a face covering.**
- Y6 will enter the building from the gate on Leamington Road only.
- Y5 will enter via the gate on Scarisbrick Drive only. (By the fitness equipment)
- Nursery children will enter via the nursery gate on Scarisbrick Drive only. The gate between the yard and nursery will be closed at all times.
- Reception and Y1 children will use the double gate on Scarisbrick Drive only.
- Y2,3 and 4 will use the gate by the dinner centre on Scarisbrick Drive only.

**You will need to make sure you leave in plenty of time as it will take longer than normal to enter school. If you are late, it will take even longer to come through the office. You must arrive on time for everyone to stay as safe as possible!**


Nursery Children only

- Picking up – You must stay back from the classroom and stick to social distancing rules of 1m+ at all times. You will leave via the gate your child has been allocated above.
- Only one adult may enter the yard when picking up and dropping off. Please do not congregate at the gates or outside school.
- When entering the school your child will use hand sanitizer and will be expected to wash their hands regularly throughout the day.

### **The School Day**

*This will be as normal except the following:*

- Each year group will become its own Kingdom and the Kingdom's will not mix or interact. The staff in the Kingdom will not mix or interact with any other.
- There will be no mass gatherings and no after school clubs.
- Assemblies will be virtual.
- There will be no visits, Y6 residential, trips or Christmas productions. (More details about PGL to follow)
- Break times and lunchtimes will be staggered.
- PE coaches and our Music teacher will be allowed in school. Equipment will be cleaned between groups and singing is not allowed.
- Please see the 'Kingdom Rules' which will be placed around school.
- Any children deciding to 'pretend' they are sharing Covid-19 or coughing/spitting/breaking social distancing rules will have meetings with their family, Mr. Vine and the Governing Body.
- Normal school rules apply and excellent behavior is expected at all times. Change is not an excuse.
- The priorities for 2020-21 will be children's mental health/wellbeing (Zones of Regulation) and the catch up curriculum. We will have extra teachers in all year groups.
- Children will need to bring a full water bottle each day.

### **Parents Visiting School**

- Parents will not be allowed to enter the school building unless it is an emergency. Parents are welcome to come to the main office but you must be prepared to use hand sanitizer and speak through the glass divide. If parents want to speak to someone in school, they can phone (0151 284 7848) at any time or email ([office@leamington.liverpool.sch.uk](mailto:office@leamington.liverpool.sch.uk)).
- Parents are not allowed to bring children into the school/on the corridor.
- Parents are not to drop off lunch b
- Safeguarding meetings will take place virtually or over the phone at all times.
- We will not be conducting any home visits unless needed. **We must have up to date contact details for all parents.**
- Children are not allowed to use any of the outdoor equipment at any time.

### **General**

- Attendance is compulsory but we understand that some of you may have concerns. We have implemented the guidance to make sure everyone is safe. Our risk assessments have been updated and are available on our school website: <http://leamingtonprimary.com> If you have any concerns regarding attendance you must speak with Jackie Stocks to see what support we can give. Fixed penalty notices can be used as a last resort.
- If anyone in the school becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they must be sent home and advised to follow '[stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus \(COVID-19\) infection](#)', which sets out that they must self-isolate for at least 7 days and should [arrange to have a test](#) to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19). Other members of their household (including any siblings) should self-isolate for 14 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms.

- if someone tests positive, they should follow the [‘stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus \(COVID-19\) infection’](#) and must continue to self-isolate for at least 7 days from the onset of their symptoms and then return to school only if they do not have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell/taste. This is because a cough or anosmia can last for several weeks once the infection has gone. The 7-day period starts from the day when they first became ill. If they still have a high temperature, they should keep self-isolating until their temperature returns to normal. Other members of their household should continue self-isolating for the full 14 days.

***School will work with the local protection team following any cases of Covid-19. Decisions will be made at the time regarding sending pupils home.***

***We would like to remind you all that we all have an important role to play to ensure that our children and school community remain safe. Patience and support is needed by all.***
