Maps give us information about places and use basic symbols to represent places. This allows users to identify places of interest easily from an aerial view. The symbols are put into a key which explains the symbols use on maps.  We can use directional language to describe the location of a place: north, south, east, west; forwards, backwards; left, right, up and down.  Location means the place where something is. Norris Green is an area within the city of Liverpool, England. England is shown on the map as part of the United Kingdom.  Landmarks are significant places within an area which are easily recognisable. Local areas and landmarks often change over time.
