<p>Interesting Facts</p>	<p>Humans survived by using sharp stone tools to kill animals, such as mammoths. Dead animals proved to be useful resources because they provided food to eat and skins to keep warm.</p>	<p>archaeologist</p>	<p>someone who studies the past by exploring old remains artefacts or objects from the past that shows evidence of how people lived</p>	
<p>Skara Brae is a Neolithic settlement discovered in Scotland. One of the oldest stone tools found is about 3.4 million years old and was found in Africa</p>	<p>Their bones were another useful material for making tools. Evidence of the Stone Age includes discoveries of: cave paintings, early tools such as flints, fire hearths, settlements such as Skara Brae, Cheddar Man - the remains of a Mesolithic man. Egyptians were building the pyramids around the same time as the Neolithic era.</p>	<p>civilisation</p>	<p>a human society with its own social organisation and culture.</p>	
		<p>era</p>	<p>a period of time in history. An era often begins or ends with an important event.</p>	
		<p>extinct</p>	<p>no longer has any living members, either in the world or in a particular place</p>	
		<p>flint</p>	<p>a piece of stone used in fire-starting and as a tool</p>	
		<p>Palaeolithic</p>	<p>Old or 'ancient' Stone Age.</p>	
		<p>Mesolithic</p>	<p>Middle Stone Age</p>	
		<p>Neolithic</p>	<p>New Stone Age</p>	
		<p>settler/ settlement</p>	<p>people who migrate to a new place. When people start a community, this is a settlement</p>	
		<p>Bronze Age</p>	<p>historical period when people made tools and weapons from bronze</p>	
		<p>Iron Age</p>	<p>Historical period when people made tools and weapons from iron.</p>
