 How, why and when WW2 began/ ended: You will research and explore how the world war began, how it followed on from WW1; who the influential figures were; the role of the axis and the allies and how it all came to an end. What life was like for an evacuee: You will step into character and discover the journey children took; the changes they had to adapt to; how host families treated the children and what it was like to spend time in an air raid shelter. What happened during the Blit2? You will explore the air raid sirens, shelters and the emotions of people who experienced the bombings. How and why did Nicholas Winton save 669 children? You will interview Nicholas Winton following a fact-finding session, exploring the actions he took to save children from the dangers posed by the Nazis. You will explore the measures he took to avoid being found out and how the children now feel and why the final train did not reach its destination. Who was Anne Frank and what happened to Jewish people during WW2? Millions of Germans were imprisoned and killed because they didn't fit the image of the 'perfect' German. Anne Frank's family were forced into hiding to avoid being taken to concentration camps. Her diary is legendary as it tells the true story of Jews at that time.
