		Anglo-Saxons	a Germanic inhabitant of England between the 5th century and the Norman Conquest.	
<p>The Anglo-Saxons are made up of three tribes that came from Europe. This is how we've come to know them as the Anglo-Saxons today.</p> <p>Many towns and villages still carry their Anglo-Saxon names today, including “England” which comes from the Saxon word “Angle-Land”.</p>	<p>Christian Religion was important throughout the Anglo-Saxon time period. The first Anglo-Saxons followed a Pagan religion who often worshipped gods and goddesses with nature playing a big part in their religion. Anglo-Saxons religions tended to focus on values that were important to warriors – like courage and bravery.</p> <p>Anglo Saxons settled in Britain because they needed specific things to live.
