I know that different events have happened in the past.  I know that important events have happened in the past.	Norris Green was not always here. The plot of land had been owned by the Norris family (owners of Speke Hall), although they never did anything with the land.  The family held the land until 1652, when Edward Norris was accused of being a Royalist (explain the definition – he was supporting Charles I), although this was never proven. They fought for their land although it was never returned to them.  There were other residents of the house until 1894 although the lands were neglected until 1924. In 1924, Liverpool Corporation bought the land and developed homes including a restoration of the park.  The house was demolished in 1931 and the park was publicly opened in 1933. Some features of the mansion still remain.
